# Initial-Eligibility Standards

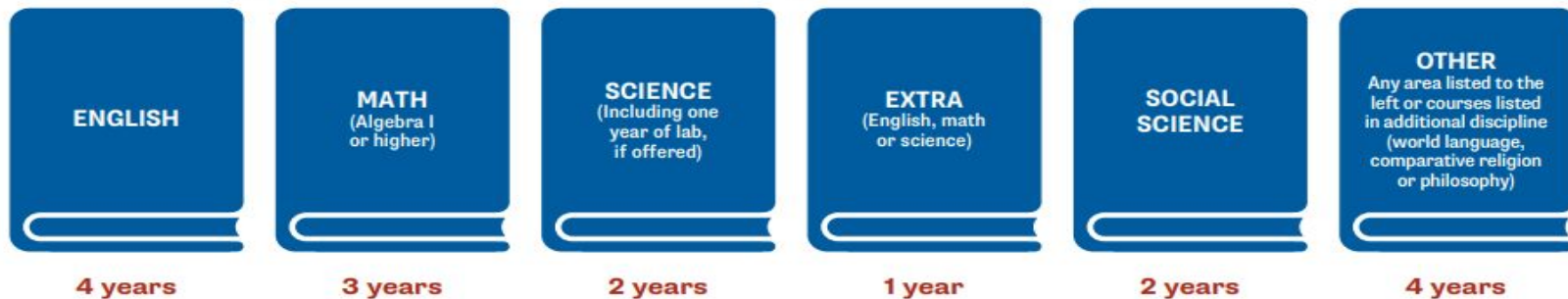
If you want to compete in NCAA sports, you need to register with the NCAA Eligibility Center at [eligibilitycenter.org](http://eligibilitycenter.org). Plan to register before your freshman year of high school. For more information on registration, visit [on.ncaa.com/RegChecklist](http://on.ncaa.com/RegChecklist).

## Academic Requirements

**Division I and II** schools require you to meet academic standards. To be eligible to practice, compete and receive an athletics scholarship in your first year of full-time enrollment, you must meet the following requirements:

### Division I

1. Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the following areas:



2. Complete your 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in eight academic semesters or four consecutive academic years from the start of ninth grade. If you graduate from high school early, you still must meet core-course requirements.
3. Complete 10 of your 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits, including seven in English, math or science, before the start of your seventh semester. Once you begin your seventh semester, any course needed to meet the 10/7 requirement cannot be replaced or repeated.
4. Earn a minimum 2.3 **core-course GPA**.
5. Ask your high school counselor to upload your **final official transcript** with proof of graduation to your Eligibility Center account.

## Division II

1. Earn 16 NCAA-approved core-course credits in the following areas:



2. Earn a minimum 2.2 **core-course GPA**.
3. Ask your high school counselor to upload your **final official transcript** with proof of graduation to your Eligibility Center account.

## Division III

While **Division III schools** set their own admissions and academic requirements, **international student-athletes** (first-year enrollees and transfers) who are enrolling at a Division III school after Aug. 1, 2023, must be certified as an amateur by the Eligibility Center. Contact the Division III school you plan to attend for more information about its academic requirements.

## **OVERALL**

**THE NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER CERTIFIES WHETHER PROSPECTIVE COLLEGE ATHLETES ARE ELIGIBLE TO PLAY SPORTS AT NCAA DIVISION I OR II INSTITUTIONS. IT REVIEWS THE STUDENT-ATHLETE'S ACADEMIC RECORD, SAT OR ACT SCORES, AND AMATEUR STATUS TO ENSURE CONFORMITY WITH NCAA RULES.**

# **NCAA PRESENTATION 10/20/24**

## **NIL RULES**

- **STUDENTS MAY NOT MAKE REFERENCE TO PIAA OR PIAA MEMBER SCHOOL**
- **STUDENTS MAY NOT WEAR SCHOOL UNIFORMS**
- **STUDENTS MAY NOT ENDORSE PROMOTE 3RD PARTY ENTITIES DURING TEAM SCHOOL ACTIVITIES**
- **STUDENTS MAY NOT WEAR APPAREL OR DISPLAY LOGO INSIGNIA OR IDENTIFYING MARK OF AN NIL PARTNER DURING ANY TEAM SCHOOL ACTIVITIES UNLESS IT IS PART OF THE UNIFORM**
- **STUDENT MUST NOTIFY PRINCIPAL OR ATHLETIC DIRECTOR OF THEIR SCHOOL WITHIN 72 HOURS UPON ENTERING INTO ANY TYPE OF NIL CONTRACTS AGREEMENT**
- **STUDENTS MAY NOT ENGAGE IN ANY NIL ACTIVITIES INVOLVING DISPLAYING OR ENDORSING PRODUCTS OR SERVICES WHICH ARE PROHIBITED BY PIAA BY LAWS**



# Eligibility Center Q & A

- **When should a student-athlete register with the EC?**
  - No later than end of Sophomore year is highly recommended
- **What if a SA cannot afford to pay for the EC?**
  - Fee waivers are available through NCAA and confirmed by current high school. Does the student receive free lunch?
- **What if the SA does not meet the GPA standard?**
  - Summer school before enrollment is an option, summer classes in previous years can always help!
- **What happens if the SA does not meet the core course standard?**
  - Summer school before enrollment; NCAA also maintains a waiver process for certain situations (IEP/504's, COVID, family health issues, student health issues, financial issues, etc)

# Eligibility Center Reminders

- Students must register with the EC in order to take an official recruiting visit and to receive a written athletic scholarship offer
- ALL high school transcripts must be sent to the EC and must be sent directly from the high school to the EC
- Access to the Amateurism section of the EC opens on April 1 of the student's senior year
- Core courses
  - Every school has two EC contacts
  - Schools should update core courses yearly
  - Honors/AP grading scale vary by high school
